

GU Graduate Class – Glendale City Court - “Domestic Violence and Mock Trial.” Glendale is offering a new graduate course for Glendale residents or Glendale business owners who have graduated from the Glendale University 101 program.

The City Court tries criminal and civil traffic violations, as well as non-traffic criminal misdemeanor cases. Some of the cases the court handles include driving under the influence, drag racing, child restraint violations and assault.

This two-day class will focus on learning the domestic violence laws in the State of Arizona and how DUI criminal cases are processed. The first night will also cover the roles of the prosecutor, defense attorney, judge and jury. The second night will be an interactive night where the students participate in a mock trial. Both classes will be held at the Glendale City Court complex, located at 5711 W. Glendale Avenue. Parking is available along

57th Avenue and in a public parking lot located south of the court building.

This course will be held from 6 - 8 p.m. on Sept. 28 and 6 - 9 p.m. on Sept. 29. Please leave all non-essential items at home as all students will pass through security screening prior to entering the court room.
