Re: Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) Invoice for FY 2017 Enclosed

Dear Ms. Wilmoth,

The Maricopa County Department of Emergency Management (MCDEM) works hard to deliver a tangible value on the dollars provided through our intergovernmental agreements. In Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17), we will provide our partners:

- **Maintain a current and pertinent Emergency Operations Plan (EOP).** All EOPs within Maricopa County are designed to complement one another as well as the County EOP. These meet state statute requirements tying into the state and federal plans.
- **Complete the annual update of the Five (5) Year Multi-jurisdictional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan .** This plan thoroughly identifies hazards within your community, prioritizes the risk and allows the jurisdictions to target dollars as efficiently as possible.
- **Work with jurisdictions to identify eligible wild-fire fuels reduction projects as illustrated in the Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP).** The Maricopa County Board of Supervisors officially adopted the 5-year plan update on January 21, 2015. This plan has identified your wildfire interface area, allowing the jurisdiction to reduce fire risk, as well as more efficiently plan for and respond to wildfires that threaten your community.
- **Provided Emergency Management Services –** Each dollar from municipal IGAs is matched with a dollar from the county general fund and then matched with two from federal sources. This allows each of the communities to leverage resources collectively in the event of an emergency. In times of strained resources, the leverage is invaluable for all communities in the county. This year alone, Maricopa County has assisted cities/towns extensively during two separate flooding events and multiple exercises.
- **Offer WebEOC administration and training to a number of our customers and plan a continued rollout to others.** This Emergency Operations Center software allows the IGA partners to electronically connect with the county for a coordinated response to events incidents/emergencies/disasters, as well as operate on a stand-alone basis. MCDEM staff is working with East and West Valley partners to standardize all EOC ICS forms among our communities to facilitate the sharing of staff for major events incidents/emergencies/disasters where and when it makes sense. Ideally, this also gives us virtual and functional access to back up EOCs and personnel where once such backups didn't exist. Direct Resource Inventory search, deployment, and tracking from the Resource Request form (ICS-213RR) in WebEOC. Provide a streamlined framework within WebEOC for documenting equipment and personnel use and damage assessment for recovery and reimbursement.
- **Provide Jurisdictions COOP software administration and resources to continue to be prepared for all hazards.** This software will enable jurisdiction internal preparedness/continuity capabilities.

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
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- Access to training will be available via Arizona Division of Emergency Management
- County-wide whole community shelter planning: Sheltering workgroup comprised of multiple representation of whole community. County-wide shelter plan template. Shelter Identification- MCDEM continues work with Red Cross and local EM to identify and inventory suitable shelters within their Jurisdictions to be utilized during an emergency event. Shelter inventory of accessible shelters (county specific inventory system separate from the National Shelter System).
- Continue to coordinate school districts within Maricopa County to become partners in the AZMAC agreement for shared resources during emergencies and exercising adopted emergency plans.

We very much look forward to this coming year and working with your community to strengthen integrated response, ensuring public safety.


