

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT
CITY HALL BUILDING EXTERIOR/COUNCIL BUILDING/AMPHITHEATRE PRELIMINARY
STUDY
PROJECT NUMBER 161708

This Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into and effective between CITY OF GLENDALE, an Arizona municipal corporation ("City") and Dick and Fritsche Design Group, an Arizona corporation, authorized to do business in the State of Arizona, ("Consultant") as of the 12 day of December, 2016 ("Effective Date").

RECITALS

- A. City intends to undertake a project for the benefit of the public and with public funds that is more fully set forth in **Exhibit A**, Project (the "Project");
- B. City desires to retain the professional services of Consultant to perform certain specific duties and produce the specific work as set forth in the attached **Exhibit B**, Project Scope of Work ("Scope");
- C. Consultant desires to provide City with professional services ("Services") consistent with best consulting or architectural practices and the standards set forth in this Agreement, in order to complete the Project; and
- D. City and Consultant desire to memorialize their agreement with this document.

AGREEMENT

The parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Key Personnel; Other Consultants and Subcontractors.

1.1 **Professional Services.** Consultant will provide all Services necessary to assure the Project is completed timely and efficiently consistent within Project requirements, including, but not limited to, working in close interaction and interfacing with City and its designated employees, and working closely with others, including other consultants or contractors, retained by City.

1.2 **Project Team.**

a. Project Manager.

- (1) Consultant will designate an employee as Project Manager with sufficient training, knowledge, and experience to, in the City's opinion, complete the project and handle all aspects of the Project such that the work produced by Consultant is consistent with applicable standards as detailed in this Agreement; and
- (2) The City must approve the designated Project Manager.

b. Project Team.

- (1) The Project Manager and all other employees assigned to the Project by Consultant will comprise the "Project Team."
- (2) Project Manager will have responsibility for and will supervise all other employees assigned to the Project by Consultant.

c. Discharge, Reassign, Replacement.

- (1) Consultant acknowledges the Project Team is comprised of the same persons and roles for each as may have been identified in **Exhibit A**.
- (2) Consultant will not discharge, reassign, replace or diminish the responsibilities of any of the employees assigned to the Project who have been approved by City

without City's prior written consent unless that person leaves the employment of Consultant, in which event the substitute must first be approved in writing by City.

- (3) Consultant will change any of the members of the Project Team at the City's request if an employee's performance does not equal or exceed the level of competence that the City may reasonably expect of a person performing those duties, or if the acts or omissions of that person are detrimental to the development of the Project.

d. **Subcontractors.**

- (1) Consultant may engage specific technical contractors (each a "Subcontractor") to furnish certain service functions.
- (2) Consultant will remain fully responsible for Subcontractor's services.
- (3) Subcontractors must be approved by the City.
- (4) Consultant will certify by letter that all contracts with Subcontractors have been executed incorporating requirements and standards as set forth in this Agreement.

2. **Schedule.** The Services will be undertaken in a manner that ensures the Project is completed timely and efficiently in accordance with the Project.

3. **Consultant's Work.**

3.1 **Standard.** Consultant must perform Services in accordance with the standards of due diligence, care, and quality prevailing among consultants having substantial experience with the successful furnishing of Services for projects that are equivalent in size, scope, quality, and other criteria under the Project and identified in this Agreement.

3.2 **Licensing.** Consultant warrants that:

- a. Consultant and its Subconsultants or Subcontractors will hold all appropriate and required licenses, registrations and other approvals necessary for the lawful furnishing of Services ("Approvals"); and
- b. Neither Consultant nor any Subconsultant or Subcontractor has been debarred or otherwise legally excluded from contracting with any federal, state, or local governmental entity ("Debarment").
 - (1) City is under no obligation to ascertain or confirm the existence or issuance of any Approvals or Debarments, or to examine Consultant's contracting ability.
 - (2) Consultant must notify City immediately if any Approvals or Debarment changes during the Agreement's duration. The failure of the Consultant to notify City as required will constitute a material default under the Agreement.

3.3 **Compliance.**

- a. Services will be furnished in compliance with applicable federal, state, county and local statutes, rules, regulations, ordinances, building codes, life safety codes, and other standards and criteria designated by City.
- b. Consultant must not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, genetic characteristics, familial status, U.S. military veteran status or any disability. Consultant will require any Sub-contractor to be bound to the same requirements as stated within this section. Consultant, and on behalf of any subcontractors, warrants compliance with this section.

3.4 **Coordination: Interaction.**

- a. For projects that the City believes requires the coordination of various professional services, Consultant will work in close consultation with City to proactively interact with any other professionals retained by City on the Project ("Coordinating Project Professionals").
- b. Consultant will meet to review the Project, Schedule and in-progress work with Coordinating Project Professionals and City as often and for durations as City reasonably considers necessary in order to ensure the timely work delivery and Project completion.
- c. For projects not involving Coordinating Project Professionals, Consultant will proactively interact with any other contractors when directed by City to obtain or disseminate timely information for the proper execution of the Project.

3.5 **Work Product.**

- a. **Ownership.** Upon receipt of payment for Services furnished, Consultant grants to City, and will cause its Subconsultants or Subcontractors to grant to the City, the exclusive ownership of and all copyrights, if any, to evaluations, reports, drawings, specifications, project manuals, surveys, estimates, reviews, minutes, all "architectural work" as defined in the United States Copyright Act, 17 U.S.C § 101, *et seq.*, and other intellectual work product as may be applicable ("Work Product").
 - (1) This grant is effective whether the Work Product is on paper (e.g., a "hard copy"), in electronic format, or in some other form.
 - (2) Consultant warrants, and agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend City for, from and against any claim that any Work Product infringes on third-party proprietary interests.
- b. **Delivery.** Consultant will deliver to City copies of the preliminary and completed Work Product promptly as they are prepared.
- c. **City Use.**
 - (1) City may reuse the Work Product at its sole discretion.
 - (2) In the event the Work Product is used for another project without further consultations with Consultant, the City agrees to indemnify and hold Consultant harmless from any claim arising out of the Work Product.
 - (3) In such case, City will also remove any seal and title block from the Work Product.

4. **Compensation for the Project.**

- 4.1 **Compensation.** Consultant's compensation for the Project, including those furnished by its Subconsultants or Subcontractors will not exceed \$45,272.00 as specifically detailed in **Exhibit D** ("Compensation").
- 4.2 **Change in Scope of Project.** The Compensation may be equitably adjusted if the originally contemplated Scope as outlined in the Project is significantly modified.
 - a. Adjustments to Compensation require a written amendment to this Agreement and may require City Council approval.
 - b. Additional services which are outside the Scope of the Project contained in this Agreement may not be performed by the Consultant without prior written authorization from the City.
 - c. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Exhibits to this Agreement by reference, should any conflict arise between the provisions of this Agreement and the provisions found in the Exhibits and accompanying attachments, the provisions of this Agreement shall take priority and govern the conduct of the parties.

- 4.3 **Allowances.** An "Allowance" may be identified in **Exhibit D** only for work that is required by the Scope and the value of which cannot reasonably be quantified at the time of this Agreement.
- a. As stated in Sec. 4.1 above, the Compensation must incorporate all Allowance amounts identified in **Exhibit D** and any unused allowance at the completion of the Project will remain with City.
 - b. Consultant may not add any mark-up for work identified as an Allowance and which is to be performed by a Subconsultant.
 - c. Consultant will not use any portion of an Allowance without prior written authorization from the City.
 - d. Examples of Allowance items include, but are not limited to, subsurface pothole investigations, survey, geotechnical investigations, public participation, radio path studies and material testing.

- 4.4 **Expenses.** City will reimburse Consultant for certain out-of-pocket expenses necessarily incurred by Consultant in connection with this Agreement, without mark-up (the "Reimbursable Expenses"), including, but not limited to, document reproduction, materials for book preparation, postage, courier and overnight delivery costs incurred with Federal Express or similar carriers, travel and car mileage, subject to the following:
- a. Mileage, airfare, lodging and other travel expenses will be reimbursable only to the extent these would, if incurred, be reimbursed to City of Glendale personnel under its policies and procedures for business travel expense reimbursement made available to Consultant for review prior to the Agreement's execution, and which policies and procedures will be furnished to Consultant;
 - b. The Reimbursable Expenses in this section are approved in advance by City in writing; and
 - c. The total of all Reimbursable Expenses paid to Consultant in connection with this Agreement will not exceed the "not to exceed" amount identified for Reimbursable Services in the Compensation.

5. **Billings and Payment.**

5.1 **Applications.**

- a. Consultant will submit monthly invoices (each, a "Payment Application") to City's Project Manager and City will remit payments based upon the Payment Application as stated below.
- b. The period covered by each Payment Application will be one calendar month ending on the last day of the month.

5.2 **Payment.**

- a. After a full and complete Payment Application is received, City will process and remit payment within 30 days.
- b. Payment may be subject to or conditioned upon City's receipt of:
 - (1) Completed work generated by Consultant and its Subconsultants and Subcontractors; and
 - (2) Unconditional waivers and releases on final payment from all Subconsultants and Subcontractors as City may reasonably request to assure the Project will be free of claims arising from required performances under this Agreement.

- 5.3 **Review and Withholding.** City's Project Manager will timely review and certify Payment Applications.

- a. If the Payment Application is rejected, the Project Manager will issue a written listing of the items not approved for payment.
- b. City may withhold an amount sufficient to pay expenses that City reasonably expects to incur in correcting the deficiency or deficiencies rejected for payment.

6. Termination.

6.1 **For Convenience.** City may terminate this Agreement for convenience, without cause, by delivering a written termination notice stating the effective termination date, which may not be less than 15 days following the date of delivery.

- a. Consultant will be equitably compensated for Services furnished prior to receipt of the termination notice and for reasonable costs incurred.
- b. Consultant will also be similarly compensated for any approved effort expended, and approved costs incurred, that are directly associated with Project closeout and delivery of the required items to the City.

6.2 **For Cause.** City may terminate this Agreement for cause if Consultant fails to cure any breach of this Agreement within seven days after receipt of written notice specifying the breach.

- a. Consultant will not be entitled to further payment until after City has determined its damages. If City's damages resulting from the breach, as determined by City, are less than the equitable amount due but not paid Consultant for Services furnished, City will pay the amount due to Consultant, less City's damages, in accordance with the provision of Sec. 5.
- b. If City's direct damages exceed amounts otherwise due to Consultant, Consultant must pay the difference to City immediately upon demand; however, Consultant will not be subject to consequential damages more than \$1,000,000 or the amount of this Agreement, whichever is greater.

7. **Conflict.** Consultant acknowledges this Agreement is subject to A.R.S. § 38-511, which allows for cancellation of this Agreement in the event any person who is significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting, or creating the Agreement on City's behalf is also an employee, agent, or consultant of any other party to this Agreement.

8. **Insurance.** For the duration of the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall procure and maintain insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of all tasks or work necessary to complete the Project as herein defined. Such insurance shall cover Consultant, its agent(s), representative(s), employee(s) and any subcontractors.

8.1 **Minimum Scope and Limit of Insurance.** Coverage must be at least as broad as:

- a. **Commercial General Liability (CGL):** Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01, including products and completed operations, with limits of no less than **\$1,000,000** per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- b. **Automobile Liability:** Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Code 1 (any auto), with limits no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- c. **Professional Liability.** Consultant must maintain a Professional Liability insurance covering errors and omissions arising out of the work or services performed by Consultant, or anyone employed by Consultant, or anyone for whose acts, mistakes, errors and omissions Consultant is legally liable, with a liability insurance limit of **\$2,000,000** for each claim and a **\$2,000,000** annual aggregate limit.

- d. **Worker's Compensation:** Insurance as required by the State of Arizona, with Statutory Limits, and Employers' Liability insurance with a limit of no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury or disease.

8.2 **Indemnification.**

- a. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant must defend, indemnify, and hold harmless City and its elected officials, officers, employees and agents (each, an "Indemnified Party," collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") for, from, and against any and all claims, demands, actions, damages, judgments, settlements, personal injury (including sickness, disease, death, and bodily harm), property damage (including loss of use), infringement, governmental action and all other losses and expenses, including attorneys' fees and litigation expenses (each, a "Demand or Expense" collectively "Demands or Expenses") asserted by a third-party (i.e. a person or entity other than City or Consultant) and that arises out of or results from the breach of this Agreement by the Consultant or the Consultant's negligent actions, errors or omissions (including any Subconsultant or Subcontractor or other person or firm employed by Consultant), whether sustained before or after completion of the Project.
- b. This indemnity and hold harmless provision applies even if a Demand or Expense is in part due to the Indemnified Party's negligence or breach of a responsibility under this Agreement, but in that event, Consultant will be liable only to the extent the Demand or Expense results from the negligence or breach of a responsibility of Consultant or of any person or entity for whom Consultant is responsible.
- c. Consultant is not required to indemnify any Indemnified Parties for, from, or against any Demand or Expense resulting from the Indemnified Party's sole negligence or other fault solely attributable to the Indemnified Party.

8.3 **Other Insurance Provisions.** The insurance policies required by the Section above must contain, or be endorsed to contain the following insurance provisions:

- a. **The City, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds** of the CGL and automobile policies for any liability arising from or in connection with the performance of all tasks or work necessary to complete the Project as herein defined. Such liability may arise, but is not limited to, liability for materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with any tasks, or work performed by Consultant or on its behalf and for liability arising from automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed on behalf of the Consultant. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Consultant's existing insurance policies, provided such endorsement is at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10, 11 85 or both CG 20 10 and CG 23 37, if later revisions are used.
- b. For any claims related to this Project, the **Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance** with respect to the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City, its officers, officials, employees or volunteers shall be in excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- c. Each insurance policy required by this Section shall provide that coverage shall not be canceled, except after providing notice to the City.

8.4 **Acceptability of Insurers.** Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best rating of no less than A: VII, unless the Consultant has obtained prior approval from the City stating that a non-conforming insurer is acceptable to the City.

8.5 **Waiver of Subrogation.** **Consultant hereby agrees to waive its rights of subrogation which any insurer may acquire** from Consultant by virtue of the payment of any loss. Consultant agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to effect this waiver of subrogation. The

Workers' Compensation Policy shall be endorsed with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City for all work performed by the Consultant, its employees, agent(s) and subcontractor(s).

- 8.6 **Verification of Coverage.** Within 15 days of the Effective Date of this Agreement, Consultant shall furnish the City with original certificates and amendatory endorsements, or copies of any applicable insurance language making the coverage required by this Agreement effective. All certificates and endorsements must be received and approved by the City before work commences. Failure to obtain, submit or secure the City's approval of the required insurance policies, certificates or endorsements prior to the City's agreement that work may commence shall not waive the Consultant's obligations to obtain and verify insurance coverage as otherwise provided in this Section. The City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including any endorsements or amendments, required by this Agreement at any time during the Term stated herein.

Consultant's failure to obtain, submit or secure the City's approval of the required insurance policies, certificates or endorsements shall not be considered a Force Majeure or defense for any failure by the Consultant to comply with the terms and conditions of the Agreement, including any schedule for performance or completion of the Project.

- 8.7 **Subcontractors.** Consultant shall require and shall verify that all subcontractors maintain insurance meeting all requirements of this Agreement.
- 8.8 **Special Risk or Circumstances.** The City reserves the right to modify these insurance requirements, including any limits of coverage, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage or other circumstances unique to the Consultant, the Project or the insurer.

9. **E-verify, Records and Audits.** To the extent applicable under A.R.S. § 41-4401, the Consultant warrants their compliance and that of its subconsultants with all federal immigration laws and regulations that relate to their employees and compliance with the E-verify requirements under A.R.S. § 23-214(A). The Consultant or subconsultant's breach of this warranty shall be deemed a material breach of the Agreement and may result in the termination of the Agreement by the City under the terms of this Agreement. The City retains the legal right to randomly inspect the papers and records of the other party to ensure that the other party is complying with the above-mentioned warranty. The Consultant and subconsultant warrant to keep their respective papers and records open for random inspection during normal business hours by the other party. The parties shall cooperate with the City's random inspections, including granting the inspecting party entry rights onto their respective properties to perform the random inspections and waiving their respective rights to keep such papers and records confidential.

10. **No Boycott of Israel.** The Parties agree that they are not currently engaged in, and agree that for the duration of the Agreement they will not engage in, a boycott of Israel, as that term is defined in A.R.S. §35-393.

11. **Notices.**

- 11.1 A notice, request or other communication that is required or permitted under this Agreement (each a "Notice") will be effective only if:

- a. The Notice is in writing; and
- b. Delivered in person or by overnight courier service (delivery charges prepaid), certified or registered mail (return receipt requested).
- c. Notice will be deemed to have been delivered to the person to whom it is addressed as of the date of receipt, if:

(1) Received on a business day before 5:00 p.m. at the address for Notices identified for the Party in this Agreement by U.S. Mail, hand delivery, or overnight courier service; or

(2) As of the next business day after receipt, if received after 5:00 p.m.

- d. The burden of proof of the place and time of delivery is upon the Party giving the Notice.
- e. Digitalized signatures and copies of signatures will have the same effect as original signatures.

11.2 **Representatives.**

- a. Consultant. Consultant's representative (the "Consultant's Representative") authorized to act on Consultant's behalf with respect to the Project, and his or her address for Notice delivery is:

- b. City. City's representative ("City's Representative") authorized to act on City's behalf, and his or her address for Notice delivery is:

- c. Concurrent Notices.

- (1) All notices to City's representative must be given concurrently to City Manager and City Attorney.
- (2) A notice will not be deemed to have been received by City's representative until the time that it has also been received by the City Manager and the City Attorney.
- (3) City may appoint one or more designees for the purpose of receiving notice by delivery of a written notice to Consultant identifying the designee(s) and their respective addresses for notices.

- d. Changes. Consultant or City may change its representative or information on Notice, by giving Notice of the change in accordance with this section at least ten days prior to the change.

12. Financing Assignment. City may assign this Agreement to any City-affiliated entity, including a non-profit corporation or other entity whose primary purpose is to own or manage the Project.

13. Entire Agreement; Survival; Counterparts; Signatures.

13.1 **Integration.** This Agreement contains, except as stated below, the entire agreement between City and Consultant and supersedes all prior conversations and negotiations between the parties regarding the Project or this Agreement.

- a. Neither Party has made any representations, warranties or agreements as to any matters concerning the Agreement's subject matter.
- b. Representations, statements, conditions, or warranties not contained in this Agreement will not be binding on the parties.

- c. Inconsistencies between the solicitation, any addenda attached to the solicitation, the response or any excerpts attached as **Exhibit A**, and this Agreement, will be resolved by the terms and conditions stated in this Agreement.

13.2 **Interpretation.**

- a. The parties fairly negotiated the Agreement's provisions to the extent they believed necessary and with the legal representation they deemed appropriate.
- b. The parties are of equal bargaining position and this Agreement must be construed equally between the parties without consideration of which of the parties may have drafted this Agreement.
- c. The Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona.

13.3 **Survival.** Except as specifically provided otherwise in this Agreement, each warranty, representation, indemnification and hold harmless provision, insurance requirement, and every other right, remedy and responsibility of a Party, will survive completion of the Project, or the earlier termination of this Agreement.

13.4 **Amendment.** No amendment to this Agreement will be binding unless in writing and executed by the parties. Electronic signature blocks do not constitute execution for purposes of this Agreement. Any amendment may be subject to City Council approval.

13.5 **Remedies.** All rights and remedies provided in this Agreement are cumulative and the exercise of any one or more right or remedy will not affect any other rights or remedies under this Agreement or applicable law.

13.6 **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is voided or found unenforceable, that determination will not affect the validity of the other provisions, and the voided or unenforceable provision will be reformed to conform with applicable law.

13.7 **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts will together comprise one instrument.

14. **Term.** The term of this Agreement commences upon the Effective Date and continues for a one (1) - year initial period. The City may, at its option and with the approval of the Consultant, extend the term of this Agreement an additional one year. Consultant will be notified in writing by the City of its intent to extend the Agreement period at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the expiration of the original or any renewal Agreement period. There are no automatic renewals of this Agreement.

15. **Dispute Resolution.** Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this contract, or the breach thereof, shall be settled by arbitration administered according to the American Arbitration Association's Commercial Arbitration Rules, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.







EXHIBIT A
Professional Services Agreement

PROJECT

Provide a Preliminary Study for City Hall/Council Chambers and Amphitheatre to include painting and other options to enhance the exterior; determine the adequacy of the amphitheatre for events; and planning concepts.

This information will help City leaders make informed, data-driven investment decisions in their public facilities, thereby improving asset performance, minimizing costs and reducing risk.

EXHIBIT B
Professional Services Agreement

SCOPE OF WORK

A. PROJECT SCOPE AND CRITERIA

1. City Hall Exterior:

- a. Explore options for different colors for the building façade. The City wants a new look, not “beige”. This study will look at painting or other options to enhance the existing exterior materials.
 - b. Look at areas in the exterior wall that are cracking, or have flashing issues, and make corrective recommendations.
 - c. Explore options for pigeon control at exterior windows.
 - d. Look at how the exterior entries and circulation spaces can be improved:
- Existing conditions are dark and uninviting near the main entries.
 - Wayfinding needs improvement.
 - Lighting needs improvement, including daytime lighting.
- e. Based on City-approved color palette, prepare documents sufficient for bidding of exterior building painting and related improvements. The City will be responsible for securing bids and managing the actual painting project through construction.

2. Amphitheatre:

- a. We will meet with Parks & Recreation / Special Events group to discuss how the Amphitheatre is used, and if existing performance space is adequate.
- b. Determine what specific improvements is the City interested in looking at.
- c. Determine if existing public seating areas are adequate and work well in the current configuration.
- d. Explore the addition of shading structures over the performance areas and possibly the seating areas.
- e. The existing electrical room will remain, but our engineer will look at the need for additional power or outlets to support Amphitheatre events.
- f. Review adequacy of existing Amphitheatre lighting. Discuss with staff if additional lighting is needed or if performance groups provide their own supplemental lighting.
- g. Explore the relationship of the Amphitheatre with Murphy Park as an integral event space, and recommend planning ideas that will enhance the overall usage of the entire area.
- h. Evaluate existing infrastructure of the Amphitheatre and Park as to capacity to support current and future events and activities.
- i. As part of the study related to shading structures over the performance area, evaluate the acoustic impact of the roof as a possible “band shell” or reflective surfaces.
- j. As part of the study related to shading over the spectator seating, evaluate options to the existing grass that would work without direct sunlight. Such options could include artificial turf or permanent seating and hardscape.
- k. The current size of the performance space is adequate, but the concrete surface is not suitable for performances. Explore optional flooring ideas, either movable or permanent, that could cover the concrete.

3. Lower level Council Building:

- a. Consider how the staff lounge / breakroom can be improved:
- Existing built-in cabinets are not used.
 - Consider a variety of seating / gathering areas including tables, raised counters, tech bars, casual group seating, informal meeting / lunch tables and other opportunities to promote staff interaction, collaboration and recreation.
- b. Consider how the lounge can have better connectivity to the Amphitheatre, or if the performance area could be used for outside staff seating.

c. Consider how the existing lower level meeting rooms could be re-envisioned. Nothing is "sacred" in this area except key technology / building systems rooms which would be difficult to relocate.

d. The general impression of the lower level is dark and unattractive, winding hallways make wayfinding difficult. The low ceiling height and low lighting levels need to be addressed.

e. Existing meeting rooms are currently used as dressing areas for events and performers. As part of the overall evaluation of this level, explore the potential for better dressing room configurations with toilets and other amenities normally associated with performance venues.

f. Consider storage locations for props and other materials used in connection with the Amphitheatre.

4. Council Chambers:

a. This area is generally OK as is, but we will look at a few specific areas that could be improved.

b. The public vestibule was not designed with security screening in mind. We will look at ways to improve the flow of staff and visitors while maintaining good security.

c. The area in front of the dais in the Council Chambers is tight. There have been suggestions to find a way to hold Council workshops in this area. We will study possible modifications to the area in front of the dais, and the access from the main floor to the raised dais. The goal would be to provide space on the main floor for a large conference table and flexible seating.

d. Existing interior finishes will be evaluated for future upgrades if required.

e. Existing technology and lighting will be evaluated for potential future upgrades.

5. DFDG has received PDF's of the original building plans and plans of subsequent remodels. We will use these documents as the basis for our study and planning. The Council Chambers building is 31,242 SF area according to the Facilities spreadsheet; however based on the floor plan dimensions, it scales only around 17,400 SF. This discrepancy will need clarification.

B. BASIC SERVICES PROVIDED

1. DFDG will perform architectural services consistent with the scope as outlined above.

2. DFDG will retain specialty subconsultants including:

a. Electrical (LSW Engineers).

b. Cost estimating (Rider Levitt Bucknall)

We have identified subconsultant fees as separate line items so that the City may elect to contract directly for these services.

3. Our team will attend periodic review meetings with the City's project manager and facilities group. We have included up to 3 meetings, plus 2 separate meetings with City management and other officials to present concepts and findings.

4. Deliverables include:

a. Preliminary Assessment of the City Hall exterior façade improvements.

b. Preliminary analysis and planning concepts for the Amphitheatre.

c. Preliminary planning concepts for Council Building lower level / Chambers.

d. Deliverables will be in booklet format (10 hard copies plus electronic PDF files).

e. Bid documents for City Hall painting upgrades.

C. EXCLUSIONS The following services are not included in this proposal, and would be provided as Additional Services if requested by the City.

1. A change or increase in the project scope, or making revisions to the study or planning where such revisions are inconsistent with previously furnished information or approvals.

2. Actual design for remodel or remediation of building facades, structures or systems.
3. Analysis or abatement of asbestos or other hazardous materials if encountered.
4. Additional meetings or site visits beyond those identified in Section B.
5. Detailed measurement, field investigation or testing of existing building conditions that cannot be readily observed, or concealed conditions.
6. Analysis of building systems such as plumbing or mechanical. We do provide preliminary electrical concepts.
7. Layout or selection of furniture, workstations, or office equipment.
8. Inventory of existing furniture, workstations or equipment that might be reused in this project.
9. Design services beyond the conceptual study phase.
10. Bidding or construction phase services related to City Hall painting upgrades.
