Arrowhead Cadillac Groundbreaking. The Van Tuyl Group is breaking ground on a new \$16 million Arrowhead Cadillac dealership in north Glendale on April 10.

Glendale's Arrowhead Cadillac is expected to open in the fall of 2013 and have a broad spectrum of approximately 150 employees. The facility is proposed to be constructed in accordance with General Motors Essential Brand Elements image program for new Cadillac facilities, ensuring the highest standard possible for the Cadillac brand. Components include a spacious showroom and large, high-end service department and a shopper-friendly retail vehicle display area. Arrowhead Cadillac will also be a parts and service center for Hummer and Saab vehicles.

The 55,000-square-foot showroom and service center will be located on an eight-acre tract located at 83rd Avenue and Bell Road.

Van Tuyl Group, America's largest privately held automotive company, operates several other dealerships in the valley.

Glendale residents are invited to attend upcoming public meetings to hear about the fiscal year 2014 proposed General Fund budget and provide comment. City staff will give an overview of the proposed budget and then citizens can give comments which will be forwarded to the Mayor and Council as they make final decisions for next year's budget. The public meetings are from 6 to 7 p.m. on:

Unattended Cooking Responsible for House Fires. Investigators say that the recent fire at a Glendale home was caused when food cooking on the stovetop was left unattended. The residents were home at the time of the fire but were able to get out safely.

Unattended cooking is responsible for a majority of the house fires across the nation and causes an estimated \$1 billion in direct property damage every year.

The Glendale Fire Department reminds everyone to make “safety” your number 1 ingredient when cooking.

SAFETY TIPS

- Keep a fire extinguisher within reach when cooking in case of emergency and know how to use it properly.
- Keep the stovetop clear of flammable items like oven mitts and wooden utensils.
- Never pour water on a grease fire.
- If a fire starts in a pan on the stove, put on oven mitts and place a lid over the pan to snuff out the flames. Turn the burner off and do not remove the lid until the food has cooled off.
- If a fire starts in the oven, turn off the heat and keep the door closed to keep flames confined to the oven.
- Never wear loose fitting or baggy clothing when cooking to prevent your clothes from catching on fire.
- Make sure all smoke detectors are in good working order.
- Unplug small appliances that aren't in use.
- Never EVER leave food unattended while cooking.
