Councilmember Steve Frate Appointed Vice Mayor.

Councilmember Steve Frate is the city of Glendale's new vice mayor.

The City Council selected Frate to the position at its meeting on Tuesday (June 8). The vice mayor performs the duties of the mayor during the mayor's absence.

Frate, who assumes the vice mayor position July 1, replaces Councilmember Manny Martinez.

Frate was first elected to the City Council in 2000 and has been re-elected in 2004 and 2008. He represents the Sahuaro District.

City Council guidelines require councilmembers to nominate candidates for vice mayor each year at the first workshop in June.

Update on Purchase of NHL Coyotes. At the Tuesday, June 8 meeting, the Glendale City Council voted unanimously to approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) from Ice Edge Holdings to purchase the National Hockey League's (NHL) Coyotes team and keep the team playing in the Glendale-owned Jobing.com Arena. Thunderbird Tower Restoration Fundraising Effort. A fundraising campaign to raise money for the restoration of one of Glendale's most historic and significant landmarks – Thunderbird Tower — recently kicked off.

The tower served as the airfield control tower at Thunderbird Field, a historic airbase opened by the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1941 to provide training for American, British, Canadian and Chinese pilots. By the end of World War II, more than 10,000 pilots passed through Thunderbird Field.

At the kick-off event on June 3, Mayor Scruggs announced M&I Bank as the campaign's honorary co-chair for business development and Glendale residents Ray and Winnie Kultala as the honorary co-chairs for resident development.

Construction Information

- 75th Avenue Southbound On-ramp Closure
- June 21 at 5 a.m. – late November 2010

As part of an innovative project to provide new Loop 101 (Agua Fria Freeway) access at Beardsley Road and construct a new frontage road system and improvements at the Union Hills Drive interchange, the 75th Avenue southbound on-ramp will be closed from June 21 through late November. The closure will be effective at 5 a.m. June 21.

Detour: During the ramp closure, drivers may use 75th Avenue south to Bell Road to connect with southbound Loop 101. Union Hills Drive is not recommended as a detour route because of ongoing construction of improvements at the Loop 101 intersection.

When the work is complete, the 75th Avenue on-ramp will be combined with a new southbound on-ramp at Beardsley Road, as well as a new southbound frontage road to Union Hills Drive. ADOT's work, in partnership with the cities of Peoria and Glendale, will construct a new Loop 101 connection at Beardsley Road and improve capacity and traffic flow at the Union Hills Drive interchange. The project is also expected to relieve traffic at the 75th Avenue interchange by providing alternate freeway access at Beardsley Road.
