Local Newspaper Publisher Featured as Guest on Councilmember Sherwood's T.V. Show. Glendale Councilmember Gary Sherwood's new edition of the TV show Glendale Today features Bill Toops, the publisher of the Glendale Star and Peoria Times. The Glendale Star is considered the city of Glendale's official newspaper of public record as it is the main location where the city has posted official legal notices for decades.



During the half-hour interview, Sherwood and Toops highlight a variety of topics, including: the history of the newspaper, technological adjustments to the printing process, how the news is gathered and changes to the journalism industry. Viewers also get a behind-the-scenes look as Glendale 11's TV cameras show 12,000-plus copies of a recent edition being printed on the massive presses at the Glendale Star's production shop.

The new edition of Glendale Today debuts Friday, June 14 at 8 p.m. and can also be seen daily on Glendale 11, the city's television station. From the Heart Program. Eighteen local non-profit agencies received \$144,490 in grants Thursday (June 6) from Glendale's *From The Heart* program to provide emergency and other essential services to the city's most vulnerable children, families and elderly residents.



The grant funds will be used in a variety of ways, from providing home-delivered meals and home medical equipment to the frail and elderly, to providing emergency programs for victims of domestic violence and abuse.

The money distributed to the social services agencies was raised through the city's *From The Heart* program, which enables residents and businesses to add \$1 to their city utility bills each month. The program also receives one-time donations.

In addition, the Gila River Indian Community donated \$75,000 towards this year's grant funding. This is the third year the Gila River Indian Community has donated money to the program totaling \$225,000 over the course of the partnership.
