City of Glendale Alarm Ordinance. On June 22nd, the Glendale City Council adopted an alarm ordinance for businesses and home owners. The new program assesses fines for repeated false alarms and will be managed and enforced by the Glendale Police Department.

The ordinance will become effective August 1st with actual implementation of the ordinance conducted in phases over the coming months.

The city will issue free permits and registration to all residents and businesses that have an alarm beginning in the fall. No enforcement will be taken until alarm subscribers have had an opportunity to become better informed about the program and obtain their free permit.

Low-Income Families May Be Eligible For Repairs On Existing AC Units or EVAP Coolers.

The climbing summer temperatures this week makes everyone want to seek cool shelter. The hot weather also increases wear and tear to evaporative coolers and home air conditioning units. For high-risk groups, including the elderly and small children, it is critical that these units are operating properly.

The city of Glendale utilizes federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to provide much-needed emergency repair assistance to qualified, low-income families and elderly Glendale residents. The city's Emergency Home Repair Program utilizes a non-profit partner, Community Services of Arizona (CSA) to provide emergency repair services.
