Protect Your Identity. Identity theft is one of the fastest growing crimes in America and millions are victimized each year throughout the country. Find an Afterschool Program that Fits Your Child's Needs. For many parents, the new school year beginning in August often necessitates a scramble to find safe, affordable, and meaningful care or supervision options for their children when the school day ends. The Arizona Afterschool Program Directory is the state's only centralized, bilingual database of organized afterschool and out-of-school programs. It is a free online tool that lets parents search for programs by:

- interest and need (tutoring/academic enrichment, arts and culture, sports and recreation, character education, leadership, mentoring, etc.)
- location
- availability (before school, after school, weekend, summer break or school vacation)
- cost (free, fixed fees, sliding scale, available financing options, accepts DES subsidy, multiple-child discount, etc.)
- language (English, Spanish, multi-lingual), among other choices

Rock & Roll Paint-A-Thon Seeks Homeowner Applicants & Volunteers to Paint Homes. Do you own a single-family home but due to age or physical impairments are unable to keep it painted? If so, the Annual Rock & Roll Paint-A-Thon on Saturday, Oct. 26 may be able to help.

This program, which matches volunteers with those in need of assistance, helps maintain neighborhoods by painting homes of applicants who are ages 60 and older and/or have a permanent disability, limited financial resources, are veterans, or unable to do the work themselves.

Glendale residents who match the above criteria are encouraged to apply to have their homes painted. Volunteers willing to wield a paint brush are also encouraged to get involved.

The deadline for both homeowners and volunteer teams to apply for the program is Sept. 4. Volunteers willing to paint homes at the event on Saturday, Oct. 26, should form a team of 15 to 25 people. All volunteers must be at least 14 years old and those under 18 must have a signed parent permission form.
