### City of Phoenix, Labor Negotiations Continue

**Update: Thursday, September 30.** All three unions, the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 1433 (bus operators), International Union of Operating Engineers 428 (mechanics), and Teamsters Local 104 (maintenance staff) have agreed to extend talks to Sunday, Oct. 3, 2010 avoiding a transit strike today.

In the event that one or all unions fail to resolve their issues with Veolia's management by Oct. 3, there will be reduction in transit service beginning on Monday, Oct. 4. Veolia has indicated to Phoenix that they will be able to provide 60% of their regular weekday service during a strike, as is required by their contract. This reduced service level is equivalent to Sunday transit service, i.e. all Glendale routes will be served, but at reduced frequencies.

**West Valley Company Relocates to Glendale.** One of the world's leading mobile firefighting equipment manufacturers, Waterous, has chosen a 51,000-square-foot industrial building in Glendale as the new headquarters for its Arizona-based operation. The local subsidiary, previously located in the West Valley, produces a variety of foam equipment used by firefighters around the globe to extinguish fires. Waterous Arizona's new industrial park is located at 7612 N. 74th Ave.

In addition to the new Glendale facility, Waterous Arizona has provided \$60,000 worth of training equipment to the Glendale Regional Public Safety Training Center (GRPSTC). The GRPSTC is used by hundreds of firefighters from throughout the West Valley.

**Rock & Roll Paint-A-Thon Seeks Applicants and Volunteers.** The Seventh Annual Wells Fargo Rock & Roll Paint-A-Thon will be held on Saturday, Oct. 23. This program, which matches volunteers with those in need of assistance, helps maintain neighborhoods by painting homes of applicants who are 60 years of age or older and/or have a permanent disability, limited financial resources and are unable to do the work themselves.
