The West Valley Advocacy Center. The West Valley Advocacy Center is the comprehensive, multi-disciplinary team of professionals who work together, under one roof, to provide coordinated services to victims of family violence.

The core concept is to provide **one place** where victims can go to talk to an advocate or receive a variety of crisis services. Victims are often required to travel from location to location to seek services that are scattered through a city or county. They have to tell their story over and over again to officials. Needless to say, the criminal justice system unintentionally makes it easy for victims to become frustrated and ultimately give up.

America Recycles Day Cell Phone Collection. Time to toss those old cell phones for a good cause! The city of Glendale is celebrating America Recycles Day, Nov. 15, with a special cell phone recycling program for the month of November that will provide phones to victims of domestic violence.

The public is encouraged to drop old cell phones off at Jobing.com Arena at Gate 3 on the Northwest corner of the building, any of Glendale's three public libraries, Glendale Visitor Center or Qwest at Westgate City Center in Glendale.

After the cell phones are collected, the West Valley Advocacy Center will arrange for the phones to be recycled. Once the cell phones are refurbished, the phones will become available for victims of stalking and domestic violence.
