



A MESSAGE FROM COUNCILMEMBER MALNAR

June 17, 2016

Greetings Sahuaro District Residents,

This week City Council approved a resolution adopting the final fiscal year 2016-17 budget. We also approved the property tax levy which decreased from \$2.1965 to \$2.1490 per \$100 of assessed valuation. The total amount of the levy will increase slightly due to the value of new construction added to the City during the prior year. This is a policy reversal from prior years where the tax levy was increased to its maximum allowable level by the state.

We also adopted an ordinance which eliminates the annual \$20 alarm owner permit and the requirement for alarm owners to register their systems. The permit fee and registration had been received negatively by Glendale residents.

A resolution was also adopted which supports urban irrigation and splits the cost of operations between the land owner and the City.

FIREFIIGHTERS WARN RESIDENTS AND WINTER VISITORS OF EXTREME TEMPERATURES -

Glendale, Ariz. – With temperatures expected to climb to 110 degrees or higher this weekend, firefighters want residents, especially winter visitors still in the valley, to stay safe and know the dangers that extreme heat conditions cause.

Following these simple tips will help you survive the heat:


- * Do your daily exercise early, as well as yard work and avoid being outside during the hours of 11:00 A.M. through 6:00 P.M.
- * Drink plenty of water before, during, and after any outside activity. Stay hydrated.
- * Limit soda, caffeine, and alcohol during any outside activity.
- * Wear a hat, and apply sunscreen to prevent sunburn.
- * NEVER LEAVE CHILDREN OR PETS INSIDE OF AN UNATTENDED VEHICLE.
- * Know the symptoms of heat exhaustion- nausea, general weakness, dizziness, and body cramps. Cooling off, preferably indoors and re-hydrating your body may relieve this condition.
- * Know the symptoms of heat stroke- hot, flushed skin, dizziness, nausea, cramps, and sometimes unconsciousness. This condition is much more severe, and may require immediate medical attention.
