Free VIN Etching Program. The Glendale Police Department, in partnership with the Arizona Automobile Theft Authority, will be hosting free VIN etching from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m., Saturday, March 2 at Cabela's, 9380 W. Glendale Ave. VIN etching is the process of permanently etching the vehicle's 17-digit Vehicle Identification Number on each window on the vehicle which serves as a visual deterrent against auto theft.

The vehicle owner must show proof of ownership, current registration and complete a consent form. Don't forget to check with your insurance agent to find out if a premium discount is available for VIN etching. Call the Glendale Police Department at 623-930-2554 for more information.

Residents are invited to attend an open house to learn about projects included in the Glendale Onboard (GO) Transportation Program. The GO Program Open House will be held from 4:30-7 p.m. on Wednesday, April 24, at the Glendale Civic Center, 5750 W. Glenn Dr.

The Open House will give residents an opportunity to speak with Glendale transportation representatives and engineering consultants, learn more about current and upcoming transportation projects and provide input on the program. Representatives will be on hand to answer questions on such projects as the Light Rail, Grand Avenue, the Northern Parkway, Loop 303, and the Grand Canal and New River bicycle paths.

In 2001, Glendale voters approved Proposition 402, which dedicated a half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements and created the city's GO Transportation Program. To date, GO program efforts have resulted in expanded transit services and enhanced traffic flow and safety on Glendale streets and at intersections. There has also been further development of bicycle and pedestrian facilities throughout the city. Many additional improvements are scheduled for construction during the next several years.

The Popular Family Bike Ride Rolls Through Glendale April 14. Join hundreds of riders for wonderful weather and great exercise at the annual Glendale Family Bike Ride on Sunday, April 14 at Sahuaro Ranch Park.

This is a ride for all ages and levels of riders, from kids to adults. Both the long (15-mile ride) and short (6-mile ride) routes take cyclists on a leisurely ride through Glendale's neighborhoods and sections of the Thunderbird Paseo and Skunk Creek pathways.

This is a free ride with no registration fees. Pre-registration is available online at www.glendaleaz.com/glendalefamilybikeride. The first 500 riders that pre-register (online or via mail) will receive a t-shirt. To receive registration information through mail, call the Glendale Transportation Department at 623-930-2940. Helmets are required and can be purchased at the event for \$10.

On-site registration is from 7-9 a.m., and the ride begins at 8 a.m. All riders must get on the road by 9 a.m. Snacks and water are provided at no cost at two rest stops along the route. In addition, the GUS Bus continuously circuits the route to assist any riders in need.
